

A Community Impact Statement (CIS) was filed on September 23, 2021 stating that the Encino Neighborhood Council (ENC) and Community, being defined geographically as Mulholland Drive on the South, Victory Boulevard to the North, the 405 San Diego Freeway to the East, and Lindley Avenue to the West, kindly requests that the Los Angeles City Council Redistricting Commission take the following into account for redistricting: When given the choice between Redistricting Partners plans (maps) B2 and C2, **the Encino Neighborhood Council clearly prefers Map Concept (Plan) C2 for Encino.**

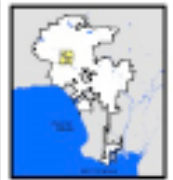
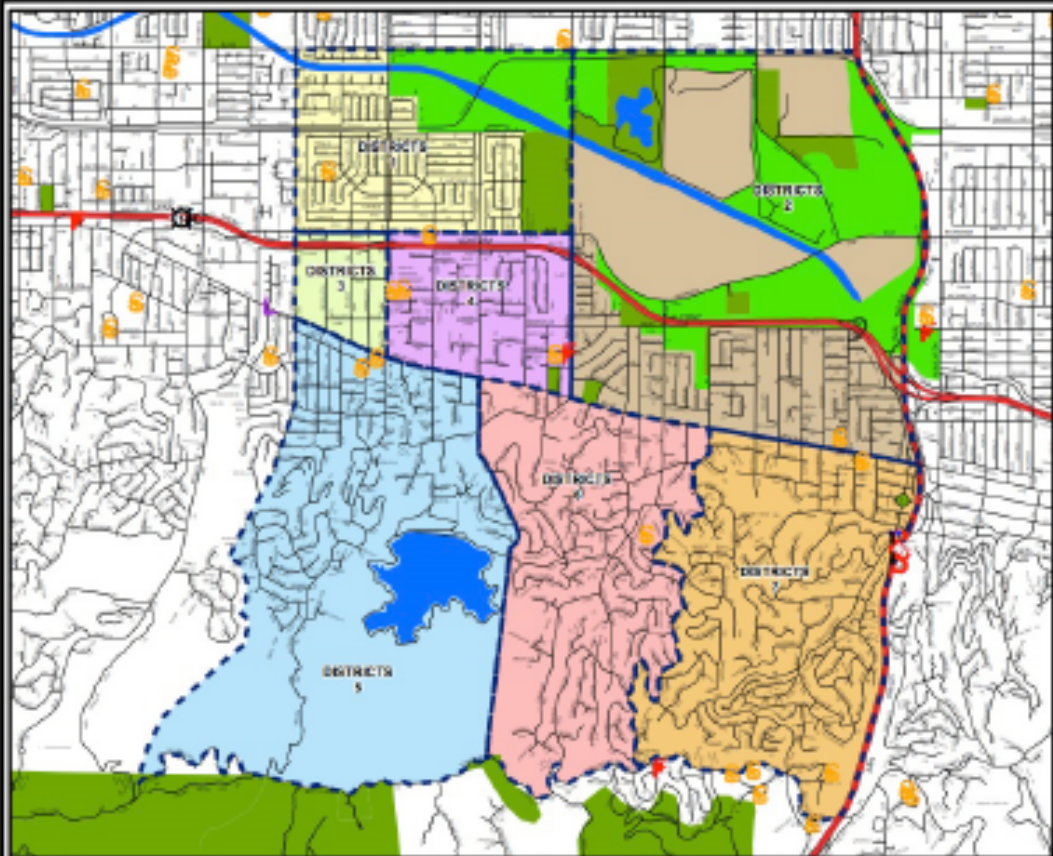
We note that there was discussion of the various options among the board members at the meeting. Two members voted against the C option, stating that they preferred to be in an East-leaning district, and four voted to abstain, feeling they did not have sufficient information, and the motion was approved by 14 members. While redistricting is an unusual (every 10 years) situation, it is incumbent on CIS filers to track the progress of proceedings and clarify their position as facts being examined change (for example map reference numbers).

This supplement to the original CIS is being filed to make clear the connection between the originally preferred plan, C2, and its successors J, K, and in part “K Corrected” and K2 (both “corrected K” and K2 separate the Sepulveda Basin from Encino). The preference of the Encino Neighborhood Council is still for Plan C2, and that Encino’s boundaries are defined geographically as Mulholland Drive on the South, Victory Boulevard to the North, the 405 San Diego Freeway to the East, and Lindley Avenue to the West. Further, the included map shows clearly that the Sepulveda Basin is part of Encino.

The initial maps considered by the Los Angeles City Council Redistricting Commission (LACCRC) were A1, B2, C2, and D1. Subsequently, at its September 21, 2021 meeting, the Los Angeles City Council Redistricting Commission (LACCRC) received four new maps – E, F, G, and H, each of which was spawned from Map B2, and which left Encino on the far west end of a mostly southeast Valley district. During the 9/21/2021 meeting, objections were raised to the E through H maps and a request was put in to produce a new Map K which reflects Encino in a southwest San Fernando Valley district containing the entire Sepulveda Basin, similar to Map C2. In addition a new Map I was produced which resembles Map B2 and a New Map J which resembles Map C2.

The new Maps I, J, and K released prior to the additional meeting which was held on September 27, 2021. Map Plans J and K, with respect to Encino, incorporate exactly the same boundaries and general geographic placement as Map Plan C2. Map Plans I, J, and K all incorporate some modifications to communities other than Encino, which are not addressed by the ENC.

A day or so later the LACCRC posted a new Map, “K Corrected”. Map “K Corrected” does a lot more than correct another district (as represented by the Greater Wilshire NC), by changing many boundaries and most significantly removing the Sepulveda Basin from the District the rest of Encino would be in. In fact, from the explanation, it was a newly created district. It does keep the non-Sepulveda Basin part of Encino in a Southwest Valley District and in that respect is similar to Map C2. As a result of late discussions at the September 27, 2021 meeting, yet two more maps were created – K2 and L. K2 was based on “K Corrected”, leaving Encino in a Southwest Valley District, but without the Sepulveda Basin. Kindly see the included Encino Neighborhood Council certified map. **The Sepulveda Basin is clearly included in Encino NC’s area and ought to be included in the same council district as the rest of Encino.**
